In Year 1 the children have been learning about the Great Fire of London.

They've been thinking about how this changed what London looked like, sequencing events chronologically and writing their own questions!

I like history because we learn about exciting things!

In Year 2 the children have learnt all about nursing during the Crimean war, they learnt about the life of Florence Nightingale, wrote a diary entry imagining how she felt and considered her legacy today. They then moved on to learn about Mary Seacole, before debating who most deserved a statue!

I like it best when we get to look at sources and we have to think about what they tell us because it's challenging, but it is fun!





In Year 5 they have been all about The Maya!  
They have considered how a civilization could thrive in the jungle, compared them to other civilizations they have studied, considered some of their achievements and looked at their architecture!  
Plus of course a chocolate workshop!

I love it when we get to use sources and research to answer historical questions!

I enjoy it when we get to have debates and think about our arguments for and against!

Year 6 have been studying World War 2. They have learnt about the causes of the war, considered appeasement and developed an understanding of what life would have been like on the home front. They have also visited the Docklands Museum.
